

FALL SPORTS UPDATE

As I write this fall wrap up, we're right in the heart of the winter sports. Girls and boys basketball are marching toward conference, regionals and nationals, and playing a good portion of their KHSAA schedules. Swim is wrapping up its season with a big January and the Archery team has had great success in November and December to start their campaign, which usually ends with worlds in June.

This fall CEC had some great things to talk about in our fall sports. To start with, the boys and girls soccer teams moved to a new host facility for home games this year. Mount Washington Sports Complex was a great fit for CEC soccer, and we're excited to start scheduling games there again next fall. The amazing facility just north of Mount Washington proper, was only 8-10 minutes from the Gene Snyder down Bardstown Road. The great field, pressbox, scoreboard, bleachers, concessions and parking provided all the Cougars needed to play a handful of home games for the girls and boys squads.



Both teams had very successful campaigns in 2025. They also sported brand new soccer kits for home and away games. They'll be looking sharp for years to come! The boys won the Landmark Tournament for the 2nd time in 3 years and had great wins and draws against top programs in the area like PRP, Doss, Jtown, Spencer County and Bluegrass United. Coach Kendall and the Cougars didn't skip a beat after a great 2024 season, which said goodbye to a lot of seniors. Again this year, the Cougars said farewell to 8 more Seniors but the team will be anchored by some great returning upperclassmen and a ton of young offensive talent in 2026. You can rest assured the Cougars will line up and test their skills against the best in the region. This

program which was coed just 4 years ago, has gotten a lot of positive press locally and had a milestone this season, as two seniors Joe Borkowsky and Austin Abbott, were both invited to play in the 6th and 7th region all star game. If you want to grow, develop and play soccer at the next level then this program is one you need to be a part of in 2026 and beyond. The team returns 2nd leading scorer Darius Porter, and 3 of the back line Senior defenders including Kaden Kendall, Sawyer McGrew and Diego Manon.

The girls soccer program had a very up and down season in the words of coaches Nathan Robertson and Ashley Raley. They battled through many injuries, missing players at key times, and were without head coach Nathan for 10 games while he and his wife Sabrina welcomed their first child Lois into the world. All that being said, they couldn't have ended the season in a bigger way taking 1st place in Division 2 at Nationals in Chattanooga. The girls went 4-0 at Nationals with MVP goalie Jewel Cockerel only giving up one goal. The team said goodbye to 9 seniors but had 26 total players this season, including our first JV girls soccer team. The team returns two of it's top 3 scorers, Pryce Ollis and Mallory Raley in 2026, along with defensive starters Kierra Rettig, Nia Lipic, Rachel Tucker, and Abbie Hoyle. Another milestone was our first girls soccer college commit, as Jaelynn Kemper plans to play for Berea College in 2026.



The girls also touted wins over Shelby County, KCD, Whitefield Academy LKY, River City and a big draw against Spencer County. They also had near misses against Bullitt Central, Male and HLS.

In 2026 both teams have already been invited to play in Male High School's interseason tournament and Bluegrass United's preseason tournament. In the first two weeks after the season, CAL, Butler, Spencer County, Shelby County, Bullitt East, Valley, Jtown, Oldham County and Valley had already reached out to schedule with our programs. That's what we call leveling up!



Girls volleyball had a great fall season as well that started mid summer with the additions of a middle school team, and a Freshman team to accompany the JV and Varsity squads. Coach Edds played a tough schedule this season, winning just about every game they were supposed to win, while also upsetting North Hardin Christian twice, along with a nice win on the road at Frankfort. The team also took 2 very tough opponents, KCD and Whitefield Academy to 5 set matches.

The volleyball team grew from 14 players to 26 in 2025. The team unveiled new uniforms in 2025, and practiced and even played a Tri Match in a new facility at Mid America East/Watterson Trail. The team still played the heart of its home schedule in late fall at Victory Baptist Gym. The middle school team won the regular season Whitefield Academy B league, going undefeated. The Varsity squad were champions at the Caverna tournament mid season, knocking off Fern Creek, Hart County, Cumberland County and Christ Fellowship. And lastly, the team took 1st place in Division 3 at Nationals to put a bow on an amazing 2025 season. The team said goodbye to the heart beat of the Varsity team, losing Senior starters Sarah Bonura, Haley Bertram, and Chloe Schramkowski, along with 3 more Senior reserves. The team however, returns a ton of young talent and a good mix of upperclassmen who got a lot of varsity time. The program is poised for another great run in 2026!

Lastly, the Cross Country team, led by Coach Jeff King, competed in around a dozen meets spanning early August to early November, and practiced diligently all season. Cross Country had around 20 athletes on the team, and got good contributions from upperclassmen and had a lot of young talent that placed very well in several meets. The girls varsity team won the Frankfort Capital View Meet defeating 51 other schools who competed. Middle Schooler Carlee Shenk placed 1st in the meet. The team has a lot of young talent to build on in future years. Coach King would love to grow the numbers in this program so we can always compete as a team in both Middle School, High School, boys and girls, along with individuals competing. Coach King has already talked about investments in the program heading into 2026, including new uniforms. Running Cross Country in the fall is a great way to prepare for winter or spring sports or to challenge yourself to new heights.

SEASON WRAP-UP

Boys' Varsity Soccer wrapped up the 2025 season at the end of October, building on the success of 2024 despite losing 7 seniors. The Cougars played a tougher schedule than last season - one that featured eight KHSAA public schools, as well as several usual rivalry games and tournaments.

The Cougars knocked off in-state rival Bluegrass United on the road in a hard fought 2-1 decision on opening day. The very next weekend, the Cougars signaled their intentions with a 2-2 draw over solid KHSAA 6th region opponent PRP, and came back two days later to draw Doss 3-3, also on the road.

The breakthrough win on the season was a statement 4-0 win over J-Town, a team that went to KHSAA regionals in 2024. That win, in addition to another victory over eventual 6th region tournament qualifier Valley High School, as well as a much deserved draw at Spencer County would have been plenty to call this season a resounding success. But the Cougars weren't finished, as they took home the Landmark Tournament crown for the 2nd time in 3 years in early October. While we couldn't find the same level of success at Nationals due to key injuries, we finished the season with a respectable 13-8-5 record.

Of particular note, our senior transfer from AIE, Austin Abbott, set a school record of 32 goals this season. Looking ahead, we graduate 8 seniors this year - those gentlemen will be greatly missed. We appreciate their service, character, and willingness to be true to CEC in wearing the blue and white for their school. Next season we will return a young but very talented squad in our quest to continue to truly build this program. Conditioning will start in late May or early June, followed by new player tryouts a little later in the summer. We will continue to play a competitive schedule and make these young men proud to play for their school.

The CEC Lady Cougars finished their third season in program history with a record of 8-7-2, and wrapped up the season as the D2 National Champions of the National Homeschool Soccer Championship. This season, they graduated their largest class of players to date with 9 seniors. They also were able to have their first ever JV team.



The season itself was filled with lots of challenges and big wins, from being plagued by injuries and having five losses decided by one goal, to taking down Whitefield, Butler, Fern Creek, and beginning to gain attention from other top schools. In their eight wins, the Lady Cougars only allowed five goals, led by Senior Jewel Cockerel in the goal. Junior Pryce Ollis led the team in scoring.

Captained by Senior Jaelynn Kemper and Junior Kierra Rettig, the Cougars entered the end of season National Homeschool Soccer Championship tournament with one goal in mind: winning it all. In previous years, the Cougars had failed to make it into the top Gold bracket of the tournament, let alone come in first. While still battling through tons of injuries, the Lady Cougars were not only able to secure the 1 seed in the Gold bracket, but they battled through 2 penalty shootouts to win it all after going 4-0 and allowing only 1 goal in regulation. This is CEC's first soccer team to ever win the NHSC Championship in their division. While Jewel Cockerel finished as the Tournament MVP for the Cougars, it was a full team effort that finally saw the Lady Cougars play to their full potential.




